Agricultural employers, farming contractors and agricultural associations who transport migrant or seasonal agricultural workers must ensure that their transporting vehicles conform to rigid safety standards. These entities are ultimately responsible for ensuring that drivers have a valid driver's permit or license to operate the vehicle. In addition, any vehicle used must have a current state vehicle inspection sticker. Beyond that, the Department of Labor (DOL) established the following regulations for passenger automobiles and station wagons used to transport 75 miles or less. Use this checklist to ensure that you are abiding by DOL guidelines for transporting your workers.

EMPLOYER CONSIDERATIONS	COMPLETE	COMMENTS
External lights, headlights, taillights, brake lights, backup lights, turn signals and hazard warning lights must be functional.		
Operational breaks must be free of leaks when stopping and holding on an incline.		
Tires must have at least 2/32 tread depth, free of cracks and defects.		
Drivers must be able to accurately steer the vehicle.		
Horn must be functional.		
Mirrors must provide full vision from the sides and rear of the vehicle.		
Windshield wipers must work and the windshield must be free of obstructions.		
Fuel system should not leak and should be secured with a fill cap.		
Exhaust systems should not leak and should discharge away from the passenger compartment.		
Windows should operate properly to provide adequate ventilation for passengers.		
Do not overload the vehicle with passengers and do not exceed the manufacturer's vehicle weight rating.		
All passengers must have a seat that is securely fastened to the vehicle, unless they are traveling less than 10 miles on primarily farm roads from one farm to another owned by the same employer.		
Vehicle should have handles for use to exit the vehicle safely.		
The passenger seating area should be free of rust, open areas or other problematic conditions that could pose a danger or cause injury.		
Vehicles must be equipped with a fire extinguisher and road warning devices.		

DRIVER PARAMETERS According to the DOL, drivers may not operate a farming labor transport vehicle unless they meet the following minimum requirements	COMPLETE	COMMENTS
Have all of their feet, arms, legs, fingers and hands.		
Do not possess a mental illness that can interfere with safe driving.		
Do not have an impairment interfering with the use of their feet, arms, legs, fingers and hands.		
Possess a visual acuity of 20/40 without glasses or wear glasses to have 20/40 vision.		
Must possess at least 10/20 hearing in their good ear.		
Cannot be addicted to liquor, narcotics or drugs.		
Passed initial and periodic physical examinations, and obtained certification to verify such.		
Must be 21 years old.		
Must have experience driving a motor vehicle for at least one year, through all four seasons.		
Must be familiar with the rules and regulations applicable to driving a motor vehicle.		
Possess knowledge of the English language sufficient enough to read signs and respond to directions and official inquiries properly.		

EMPLOYER CONSIDERATIONS	COMPLETE	COMMENTS
Vehicles must make a full stop at least 15 feet before railroad gate crossings, except when the crossing is marked as abandoned or is directed by a police officer or signal.		
Loads, tailgates and doors must be secure.		
Drivers must have an easily accessible exit that is free from obstructions.		
The amount of passengers in the vehicle cannot exceed the seating capacity of the vehicle.		
Workers cannot drive more than 10 hours in a 24-hour period.		
Floors must be smooth and free or protruding objects.		
Sides and walls of the vehicle must be at least 60 inches high.		

## **CHECKLIST** | TRANSPORTATION: REDUCING RISKS FOR AGRICULTURAL WORKERS

Vehicles should have roofs at least 80 inches from the floor to protect workers from inclement weather. Vehicles that have	
permanent roofs must have at least one emergency exit.	
The passenger compartment should be free of protruding	
nails, screws or splinters.	
Passengers must be able to communicate with drivers easily.	
Vehicles must protect passengers from the cold without using	
exhaust heaters, unenclosed flame heaters or heaters	
permitting fuel leakage or air contamination.
