Don't underestimate the power of strong thunderstorm winds, known as straight-line winds. They can reach speeds of 100 to 150 mph.

Avoid open areas such as fields, beaches and hilltops if you are outside during a thunderstorm. Seek shelter in a low-lying area but avoid standing water and metal objects such as fences, poles and equipment.

Pull over and wait it out if you are driving during a thunderstorm. Do not park under trees and avoid flooded roads.
